Hand Washing Station Workshop

Clean Hands for Happy Campers! A Message from Kathy Dorner



*Last Blue Skies, a preliminary prototype of a simple, water-efficient, bucket-based, foot-pump hand wash station was quickly put together before the festival and made available for use at the Swamp outhouses. This project came about as a result of comments from musician Jonathan Byrd, who described homemade hand washing equipment used at his home festival in North Carolina. The prototype kind of worked, but needed some tweaking. Since then, the design has been refined and is easier to assemble and more effective to use. This year at the Clean Hands for Happy Campers workshop on **Saturday morning**, there will be a demonstration of how to put these hand washing stations together, and we will assemble a few to use at Blue Skies.*

If you are going to be at Blue Skies on Saturday morning and want to build your own hand wash station at the workshop, you need to know what parts to bring with you. See the complete list on page 3 of this newsletter. Most parts are available at any hardware store or lumberyard.... some are also available at dollar stores, and others you may have around your house. In addition, if you can, **please bring a cordless drill (with charged battery) and a few drill bits (1/8", 1/4", 1/2" and 5/8"). A screwdriver that matches the screws for your hinges would also be handy.**



Hand Washing Station Parts List	Quantity
Engine primer bulb with directional flow valve. This \$10 part is the most important item in the assembly. It is usually sold with motor boat accessories. Recommended model is Attwood #9303817 , to fit 3/8" interior diameter hose. Slightly less expensive at Canadian Tire than Home Hardware - however, smaller and cheaper Kimpex primer bulbs also sold at Canadian Tire are not recommended.	1
Utility Pails – 19 litres (5 gallon), round pails – recycled are OK as long as they have only been used for non-toxic substances.	2
Lid to fit <u>one</u> of the utility pails	1
Round plastic basin, 12" diameter - or recycle a plastic salad bowl. Must be able to sit on top of the utility pail without falling in.	1
Plastic tubing , 3/8" inner diameter, 1/2" outer diameter (to fit connections on the engine primer bulb).	9 linear feet
Hose clamps - to fit 1/2" plastic tubing. Stainless steel recommended.	2
1/2" washer – galvanised or stainless steel – to add weight to the plastic tubing and keep the end submerged.	1 or more
Plastic Electrical conduit - 90 degree elbows with bell end , 16mm/ 1/2" inner diameter (find this in a hardware store with electrical supplies). For the “faucet.”	2
Poly Insert Tee -3/4 inch (find this in a hardware store with fittings for plastic plumbing pipes). To support the “faucet.” To make sure it’s the right size, test it with the bell end of the electrical conduit elbow – it should fit snugly over the base of the “T.”	1
Nylon cable ties – recommended length 6- 7" - available at hardware stores or dollar stores.	5-6
1 x 6 or 1 x 8 scrap lumber cut neatly to 10" or 12" length - or similarly dimensioned exterior grade plywood	2 pieces
High density sponge rubber ball - About 2-1/2" diameter, NOT the really squishy kind. Available at dollar stores.	Half
Door Hinge , 3-4", zinc or stainless steel with a fixed pin is recommended.	1
Screws for door hinge – if they are not included with the hinge. Stainless steel screws are recommended. Shorter than the thickness of the lumber or plywood.	match number of holes in hinge
Wooden dowel – 5/8" diameter	1 foot length
GLUE – quick setting, water resistant, high strength. Some glue will be provided at the workshop.	
OPTIONAL : -Shallow Plastic tub to fit a bar of soap (from hummus , tofu, etc) OR a mesh bag (from avocados, onions, etc) -Biodegradable bar soap
